

Course Modifications

Clarify Course Assignments

Repeat instructions/provide more detailed directions. Provide course syllabus/outline. Use individual contracts. Use individual learning packets. Use progress charts, informal individual feedback. Give instructions through several "channels" (written, oral, demonstration, etc.). Provide materials that are self checking. Brief the student on key points before an assignment. Provide examples. Group similar items.

Adapt the Regular Assignments

Require fewer correct responses for a specific grade. Allow more time. Reduce the length of the regular assignment. Break the assignment into a series of smaller assignments. Reduce the reading level. underline/outline/highlight major points. Change the format of the instructional materials.

Use Alternative Supplementary Materials

Use materials of a different format (puzzles, games, tapes, etc.). Use high interest motivation materials. Use remediation or reinforcement materials from other grade levels or subjects. Use adaptive equipment/facilities (jigs, computers, etc.). Provide study aids (cue cards, word lists, hints, etc.). Provide computational aids (calculators, multiplication charts, etc.).

Use Alternatives to Written/Reading Assignments

Assign "hands on"/performance activities. Allow oral presentations. Allow reports/projects.

Provide Alternative methods for Completing Assignments

Use a "buddy system" for reading/writing assignments. Assign an older student or volunteer for tutoring. Provide a teacher aide to assist with assignments. Assign group projects or panel presentations.

Change the Exam Requirements

Eliminate exams. Reduce the number of exams.

Alter the Exam Procedures

Stagger portions of an exam over several days. Allow open book exams or the use of notes. Allow more time. Reduce the length. Use more objective items instead of essay items. Give orally, by an individual or by cassette recorder. Allow student to record answers. Reduce the reading level. Record responses to make up own exam. Give take home test. Substitute assignment or performance for written test. Provide written list of choices for answers.



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
